To support the annual growth in consumption of bandwidth, the Department will need to increase bandwidth to office locations in the Ft. Lauderdale, Margate, and Miami field offices and Tallahassee during Fiscal Year 2015-16. This upgrade will increase the field offices from 10 Mbps to 45 Mbps and Tallahassee from 155 Mbps to 200 Mbps. Based on current rates the total cost for this increase in data services is \$33,500 and will recur annually once upgraded.

The Division of Hotels and Restaurants' Food and Lodging Inspectors are required to print and provide a paper copy of the inspection report to the operators. Operators are required to maintain the latest inspection report or a copy of the report on premises and available for review upon request. The thermal, fanfold paper used in the Inspector's mobile printers to print inspection reports is very costly. The Division proposes statutory changes to eliminate the requirement for the Inspectors to print a hard-copy of the inspection report and instead provide it electronically. The Division anticipates that the chain restaurants would take advantage of the paperless option since they currently provide inspection reports both electronically and printed onsite. If implemented, the Division expects that some small Mom and Pop single unit owners will still want to be provided a printed copy and they will be accommodated. This proposal would require changes to Chapter 509.091& 509.101(1), Florida Statutes.

The Division estimates a savings of \$75,360 in paper costs could be redirected to their Operation of Motor Vehicles appropriation category. Towards the end of each fiscal year, transfers from other categories are required to cover fuel, maintenance and repair costs of fleet vehicles. Redirecting this savings to the Operation of Motor Vehicles appropriation category will alleviate the need to do budget transfers at the end of the fiscal year.
