Dear Directors:

The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles collects approximately \$2.4 billion of State revenue annually in addition to performing work necessary for the State to receive a significant amount of federal highway funding. The budget instructions prohibited the inclusion of reduction issues that impact revenue, however, most of the Department's operations fall into that category.

We did not include any reductions in items that are key to our public safety mission or items that would have a negative impact on other State agencies or local governments. Completion of our motorist modernization project will result in efficiencies that will result in future reduction options. These reductions will be provided to the legislature for their review and consideration.

We thank you for your patience as we continue streamlining Department operations through process improvements.

 Long Range Program Plan Approved Activity: Grants Management

This issue proposes to transfer the Florida FirstNet Grant (FloridaNet) to an agency with sufficient Information Technology and State-wide interoperable communications expertise. The Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles is the sub-recipient to the Federal matching grant, the State and Local Implementation Grant Program (SLIGP). The SLIGP is a matching federal grant awarded to States and Territories to work with the Federal FirstNet agency to design a public safety broadband network for priority use by Florida First Responders. The grant was awarded in 2013 to the Florida Division of Emergency Management in the amount of \$4,961,040 with Highway Safety as the sub-recipient providing the matching funds. Highway Safety successfully completed the requirements for Phase I of this grant by conducting ongoing education and outreach as well as building a FloridaNet Governance process that involves State, Local and Tribal first responders in the decision making process associated with design efforts associated with this network. Phase II of this grant is scheduled to run through 2017 and requires gathering in-depth Information Technology and State-wide communication requirements outside the expertise and experience of Highway Safety. This change would transfer the remaining grant funds of \$4,440,634 to another agency to conduct SLIGP Phase II data collection activities and maintain Governance and Education/Outreach activities from Phase I. The selected agency will also have to identify the matching funds for the grant.

Long Range Program Plan Activity: Enforcement of Traffic Laws

This issue reduces funding to the Florida Highway Patrol's Fleet Maintenance Program for a recurring savings of \$250,000.

The Department of Management Services (DMS) establishes the criteria for replacement of motor vehicles based on the vehicle's mileage and years in service. A cost benefit analysis is also completed by DMS as part of this process. The current DMS replacement mileage for vehicles is 80,000 miles. The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, Division of Florida Highway Patrol, has a mechanism for the consistent replacement of high mileage vehicles with newer, more reliable vehicles; therefore eliminating older vehicles with high mileage that cost more to maintain. Fleet maintenance costs declined beginning with Fiscal Year 2012-13 due to the Legislature appropriating additional funding for the replacement of vehicles in Fiscal Years 2011-12 through 2015-16. As a result, Fiscal Year 2014-15 fleet maintenance costs exceeded the Fiscal Year 2008-09 base level by only 40% as opposed to the 51% as previously experienced.

In addition to decreased maintenance costs, the cost of gasoline has decreased significantly since November 2014. The expenditures in this category are directly associated with gasoline prices and will increase or decrease accordingly.

Long Range Program Plan Activity: Enforcement of Traffic Laws

This issue reduces funding for the Florida Highway Patrol's Overtime Hireback Program for a recurring savings of \$1,000,000.

The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, Division of Florida Highway Patrol, has existing contractual aid authority from the Florida Department of Transportation and other governmental agencies to operate the Overtime Hireback Program. The Overtime Hireback Program compensates Florida Highway Patrol troopers for performing law enforcement duties outside of their regular duty hours. These duties are performed on statewide work projects created by mutual agreement between the Florida Highway Patrol and other government entities. The duties performed under the Overtime Hireback Program include law enforcement patrol, construction site security, crash investigations, and roadside assistance.

This reduction of funding for the Overtime Hireback Program is possible due to the reduced level of statewide construction work projects staffed by Florida Highway Patrol troopers. However, should statewide work projects increase in the future and require additional staffing by the Patrol, a restoration of program funding may be needed.

IMPACT TO THE PUBLIC: Law enforcement presence will be reduced on the state's roadways.

This issue reduces funding for the Commercial Vehicle Enforcement's Overtime category for an annual savings of \$100,000.

Due to the critical nature of the work performed by Commercial Vehicle Enforcement on certain occasions, overtime work is an unavoidable necessity to avoid loss of service to the public. Incidental overtime costs are incurred when troopers are unable to offset overtime hours worked during their work cycle. Reducing these funds will result in a decrease in visibility of law enforcement officers and result in fewer hours being spent on commercial motor vehicle inspections which could have a negative impact on public safety.

IMPACT TO THE PUBLIC: None.

Long Range Program Plan Approved Activity: Maintain Records and Issuance of Vehicle and Mobile Homes Titles and Registrations

SUMMARY OF BUSINESS ISSUE:

This issue requests a reduction of Department funds currently utilized to purchase and print the Driver Report of Traffic Crash/Driver Exchange of Information form which has been made available electronically. Section 316.068, F.S., requires the Department to supply crash report forms to law enforcement agencies and authorizes the use of electronic forms. Over the last several years, the number of Driver Report of Traffic Crash/Driver Exchange of Information forms printed annually has decreased. Both the Department and local law enforcement agencies have been moving toward writing these forms electronically. The forms are now on various websites for easy access.

IMPACT TO THE PUBLIC: Florida citizens and law enforcement will have to primarily access the Driver Report of Traffic Crash/Driver Exchange of Information form electronically.

ELIMINATE MANUFACTURED HOMES PROGRAM

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY TO BE REDUCED OR ELIMINATED:

Long Range Program Plan Approved Activity: Monitor Mobile Home Inspections

This issue proposes to eliminate the Manufactured Homes Program and 23 FTEs within the Bureau of Dealer Services. This program is responsible for ensuring that mobile/manufactured homes manufactured and installed in Florida are in compliance with federal construction and safety standards. This program includes the In-Plant Inspection and Mobile Home Installation programs. The Department currently performs these duties as part of contract requirements with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Partial program funding is received from HUD.

The In-Plant Inspection Program is responsible for conducting in-plant inspections at all eight (8) manufacturing plants in Florida. All lines of production in the manufacturing plant are inspected on an ongoing basis to ensure the manufacturer is in compliance with design specifications approved in accordance with HUD codes. Inspectors also evaluate the plant's quality control system on an ongoing basis to assure the effectiveness of the system. Deviations from federal standards are documented and action is taken to correct the deviations and prevent reoccurrence. Inspectors

ensure that all nonconformances are corrected while the home is still in the manufacturing plant. Once a home has passed the inspection, a HUD seal is adhered to the home. The In-Plant Inspection Program consists of fifteen (15) FTEs.

The Mobile Home Installation Program consists of eight (8) FTEs and is responsible for establishing and maintaining uniform installation standards to ensure the safe and proper installation (set up) of homes in Florida. Each year, the program offers approximately sixty seven (67) training classes for installers, dealers and building officials. The program also certifies installation components (anchors, straps, devices) to ensure they meet established standards.

Eliminating both the In-Plant Inspections Program and the Mobile Home Installation Program could result in cost savings of \$1,110,088. However, there are fees and a provision for administrative fines related to these functions which are deposited into the General Revenue Fund and the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund (HSOTF). Based on Fiscal Year 14-15 revenue collections, the estimated revenue loss to General Revenue could be \$170,242 and a loss to the HSOTF of \$195,141. The net savings for the elimination of these programs is projected to be \$744,705.

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY TO BE REDUCED OR ELIMINATED:

Long Range Program Plan Approved Activity: Issuance of Automobile Dealer Licenses

This issue proposes to discontinue performing motor vehicle, mobile home, and recreational vehicle dealers records inspections. The primary purpose of inspecting dealer records is to educate dealers regarding record keeping and verify that the dealer (licensee) is complying with recordkeeping requirements mandated by statute and rule. The records inspection process provides many purposes that include the responsibility on the part of the Division of Motorist Services Motor Vehicles Field Operations Regional Office personnel to bring noncompliance to the attention of the licensed dealer and to assist the licensed dealer in creating or refining their recordkeeping system for compliance with statutory requirements.

Dealer records inspections are required to be performed biennially (every two years) for licensed dealers, within 90 days for new dealers, and whenever there is a valid consumer complaint. Without these records inspections, it is expected that number of consumer complaints will increase, fraud will increase, and may result in life-safety issues. This reduction would also eliminate the Department's proactive efforts to reduce consumer fraud and only leave reactive investigations after the consumer files a complaint.

This issue would result in a reduction of ten (10) HSMV Compliance Examiner positions and a savings of \$416,857 in Salaries and Benefits, annually. In the interest of public safety and consumer protection, these records inspections

DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY TO BE REDUCED OR ELIMINATED:

Long Range Program Plan Approved Activity: Issuance of Vehicle and Mobile Home Titles and Registrations

This issue eliminates the purchase and issuance of license plate revalidation decals. The Division of Motorist Services purchases 21 million blank print-on-demand decals annually as required by 320.06, Florida Statutes. This inventory is provided to Tax Collector and field offices statewide. The decals are issued to citizens at the time of vehicle registration and affixed to license plates in the upper right hand corner of the license plate. Last year, 19,675,000 decals were issued at the time of vehicle registration. The remaining decals are issued for vessels and mobile homes.

Eliminating license plate decals would save \$1,234,000 annually. Decals could be eliminated since law enforcement officers, at the time of stopping a vehicle, perform a license plate inquiry from their patrol car into the Florida Real-Time Vehicle Information System (FRVIS) to verify the validity of the registration, the vehicle owner and other important information. Registrants would continue to have their registration certificate printed and maintained within the vehicle. Eliminating decals would prevent law enforcement from "visually" stopping a vehicle for a possible invalid registration or for probable cause. However, it would assist law enforcement from having to deal with stolen decals.

Revenues collected in Fiscal Year 2014-15 related to the issuance of the license plate decals exceeded \$20 million. These revenues are deposited in the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund and provide funding which supports the Florida Highway Patrol, Motorist Services, and the general operations of the Department. Section 320.04(1)(b), would require revisions to ensure no negative impact to state revenues.
