Amended 2016-17 Narrative after December 4, 2015

The Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Office of the General Counsel requests \$350,000 of additional Other Personal Services (OPS) budget authority for expenses related to tax litigation cases for the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco.

Pursuant to Chapter 210, Chapters 561-565 and Chapters 567-569 of Florida Statutes, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco licenses the alcoholic beverage and tobacco industries, collects and audits taxes and fees paid by the licensees, and enforces the laws and regulation of the alcoholic beverage and tobacco industries. Section 561.025, F.S., creates the Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco Trust Fund and it is to be used to operate the Division of Alcoholic Beverage and Tobacco. Funding is transferred from the Division to the Office of the General Counsel for salaries and benefits and expenses related to attorneys who perform services for the Division.

The Office of the General Counsel is currently engaged in forty tax litigation cases with nearly twenty-five litigants for the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco. These cases have been filed in various circuit courts as well as with the Division of Administrative Hearings. The Office of the Attorney General has represented the Department because of the specialized tax litigation experience it possesses.

These tax cases generally regard the interpretation of an appellate decision concerning the taxation of Other Tobacco Products, the determination of whether cigar wraps are categorized as Other Tobacco Products for tax purposes, and whether Florida's tax and surcharge on Other Tobacco Products is constitutional.

Beyond the forty cases being litigated, a particularly well-funded litigant has filed a public records request of substantial size and scope. Considering the size and scope of this request, it remains necessary for the Department to retain the services of an e-Discovery services contractor. Additionally, Departmental staff, in conjunction with the

assistance of software provided by the e-discovery services contractor will produce and redact public records related to the cases. This process could conceivably encompass millions of documents.

The Office of General Counsel has not yet been required to expend resources on e-Discovery services in 2015, as the public records requestor has placed his request in abeyance twice this year. The first abeyance occurred in or around April, 2015, as the parties believed that a legislative solution was possible during the legislative session. Although there was no legislative solution, the requestor remains hopeful for clarifying legislation during the 2016 legislative session. As such, the matter has remained in abeyance. Thus far, no bills resolving the matter have been filed.

Absent legislation and possible settlement during the 2016 legislative session, increased litigation expenses, e-Discovery services, and public record costs are nearly certain going into Fiscal Year 2016-17. Estimated litigation expenses for the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco tax cases in Fiscal Year 2016-17:

Additional resources are needed to protect the State's interests. The Department's failure to timely respond to the outstanding public records request would result in the award of attorney's fees and costs. The Department's failure to utilize the services of an e-discovery provider would likely increase attorney hours and litigation costs. Moreover, the Department would be at a distinct disadvantage during the litigation phase without the e-discovery resource.
