2017-2018 BUDGET YEAR NARRATIVE: FACILITIES REPAIR & MAINT IT COMPONENT? NO

The Department of State, Division of Historical Resources, requests \$350,000 nonrecurring funding in the Land Acquisition Trust Fund for the re-roofing of the Mission San Luis Church with wooden shingles rather than the palmetto fawns which have served as the roof. The current roof leaks and causes erosion of the clay floor. Re-roofing the church with sturdier and durable material will increase the sustainability of the reconstruction and significantly lessen the need for specialty re-thatching every few years.

Mission San Luis functioned as the Spanish capital of Apalachee Province in La Florida, from 1656 to 1704, and outside of St. Augustine, was one of Florida's largest colonial settlements. In 1960, the Mission was designated a National Historic Landmark and has become a premier source of education for thousands of school children, residents and visitors each year.

This issue aligns with the following strategies contained in Florida's Strategic Plan for Economic Development: #27 Quality of Life and Quality of Places - Create and sustain vibrant, safe, and healthy communities that attract workers, residents, businesses, and visitors, and #29 - Quality of Life and Quality Places - Promote, develop, protect, and leverage Florida's natural, art, and cultural assets in a sustainable manner.
