AMENDED 2017-18 NARRATIVE AFTER FEBRUARY 2, 2017

The Third District Court of Appeal requests \$3,381,563 (non-recurring) to satisfactorily complete Phase III of its ongoing multi-year, interlocking, phased Security, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), and Core Systems Upgrade and Renovation Project according to Department of Management Services (DMS)-approved plans.

The Court has previously provided the Legislature with a detailed account of the scope of the project as approved by DMS and embraced by prior legislative appropriations. Regrettably, due to circumstances completely out of the control of the Court, including most prominently unexpectedly high increases in construction costs in Miami-Dade County, unforeseen construction issues occasioned by the renovation aspect of the project, revised construction estimates, and unanticipated local impositions such as a Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department mandate to upgrade aging water lines serving the Court, the Court is unable to complete the project as supported by the Legislature.

Components critical to the integrity of the project which remain unfunded include:

- 1) Acquisition of an emergency generator to facilitate the ability of the Court to be operational during natural disasters and frequent South Florida power outages, and ameliorate the present high risk of sewer and water backflow into the courthouse from the County Lift Station adjacent to the court building during such outages;
- 2) Bullet resistant windows on the second floor judges' hallways overlooking the new public lobby;
- 3) Securing the judges' parking garage from street, highway and public park view, including replacement of the judges' garage pedestrian gates with security gates;
- 4) Securing the judges' walkway from the public roadway;
- 5) Security upgrade of bollards to protect courthouse front;
- 6) Installation of gun locker for storage of weapons brought to the courthouse;
- 7) Installation of a security perimeter fence around the courthouse grounds to resolve presently occurring issues of

- 9) Addition of bullet resistant panels to protect officers at the front desk;
- 10) Repair parking lot lighting for night security;
- 11) Add x-ray machine and related security equipment to new mail room;
- 12) Resurface public and private parking lots due to construction.

With the support of the Legislature, the Court has worked diligently with DMS, AECOM (the Court's architectural firm), and Turner Construction Company to produce and implement a systematic, interlocking, and cost effective design and construction plan, to address the immediate and serious security risks faced by the Court in its urban location, as well as multiple ADA non-compliance issues. The interdependence of each element of this renovation and upgrade plan cannot be overemphasized. The Court respectfully requests final supplemental funding to finish this project.
