Section 366.015, Florida Statutes, directs the PSC to maintain liaison with other appropriate state and federal agencies whose policy decisions and rulemaking authority affect those utilities over which the Commission has primary regulatory jurisdiction. This provision requires staff to monitor and analyze federal legislation in Congress, and the activities at agencies such as the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Federal Communications Commission, and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. Significant federal legislation and agency activity routinely necessitates the preparation and submission of comments for the PSC's consideration. These activities can be prioritized to those matters most critical. Reduction in these activities would limit the PSC's ability to ensure policy and regulatory modifications do not negatively impact Florida utilities and consumers.

If overearnings occur and are undetected, utilities could earn excess revenues until the overearnings are detected and appropriate steps are taken.

The Annual Access and Toll Report is a compilation of the current access rates of the Incumbent Local Exchange Companies (ILECs). Access charges are the charges long distance companies pay for the origination, transport and termination of a call. This report compares what ILECs charge other carriers for a typical consumer long distance call. This is currently the only source where Florida ILEC access charges can be viewed on a comparative basis. The progress on bill and keep as mandated by the Federal Communications Commission will be difficult to monitor without the report.

The Annual Status of Competition in the Telecommunications Industry contains information on the level of competition in Florida and provides a perspective of the telecommunications market with an emphasis on wire line competition. The data available from carriers is limited since the PSC only has authority to request data from the wire line local providers. Other than wire line data, the findings in the report are based upon literature review and third party sources. Elimination of this report would eliminate a resource for policymakers to use in determining what, if any, issues need to be remedied in the telecommunications market. Eliminating this report would require repeal of 364.386 F.S.

The Annual Report on the Efforts of the Florida Public Service Commission to Reduce the Regulatory Assessment Fee for the Telecommunications Companies is a report that requires the Public Service Commission to describe the efforts made to reduce the regulatory assessment for telecommunications companies and include detail on the regulatory activities that are no longer required and those activities that are still required with the associated costs. This requirement may have been necessary in 2011 when the statutory framework was changed extensively for telecommunications, but since that time statutory requirements have remained largely unchanged. The PSC continues to streamline telecommunications processes and reduce staff when possible. Eliminating this report would require repeal of 364.336(3) F.S.

Pursuant to Section 364.10, Florida Statutes, the Legislature has indicated that the PSC may inform consumers about the availability of the Lifeline Assistance (Lifeline) program for low-income households. The PSC's current Lifeline educational activities focus on grass roots efforts to increase awareness about the coordinated enrollment and online application process. The Commission's outreach activities have been partly responsible for increasing Lifeline enrollment over the past several years. A reduction in outreach could negatively impact Lifeline awareness, potentially resulting in a reduction in enrollment among low-income households.

Section 367.081(4) F.S. allows water and wastewater utilities to increase rates as a matter of right to reflect increases in major operating costs by an indexed amount established annually by the Commission. For utilities that receive all or a portion of their service from a governmental authority, or from another regulated utility, the statute allows the utility to pass-through increases in the cost of service supplied by the other utility since these cost increases have been approved by a regulating authority and are beyond the utilities' control. Money collected pursuant to these increases is subject to refund for a period of 15 months after the Annual Report is filed. Eliminating staff review could result in a delayed detection of incorrect rates beyond the 15 month timeframe allowed for refund.

1) confirming changes from previous reports to ensure compliance with Commission filing requirements 2) analyzing the inputs of each account category to reconcile depreciable life to operational plans and 3) preparing a final recommendation for Commission action.

The first step is largely a consistency check and identifying errors from previous reports. Eliminating this step and accepting the study as filed would be a substantial reduction to staff hours devoted to each depreciation study. The possible consequences of this reduced review could be higher or lower depreciation rates impacting the revenue requirement approved in rate cases. Also, surveillance reports may be less accurate since the approved depreciation rates are used between rate cases for purposes of monitoring the earnings of the regulated utility.

The PSC currently requires electric utilities planning to construct major generating and transmission facilities to annually file a Ten-Year Site Plan (TYSP) containing their load and energy forecasts, conservation and renewable energy resources, and planned generation and transmission additions. Pursuant to Section 186.801, Florida Statutes, the PSC is required to perform a preliminary study of each plan and classify each one as suitable or unsuitable. While the statutes require TYSPs to be filed and reviewed at least every two years, the PSC currently requires annual filings.

Section 366.015, Florida Statutes, directs the PSC to maintain liaison with other appropriate state and federal agencies whose policy decisions and rulemaking authority affect those utilities over which the Commission has primary regulatory jurisdiction. This provision requires staff to monitor and analyze federal legislation in Congress, and the activities at agencies such as the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Federal Communications Commission, and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. Significant federal legislation and agency activity routinely necessitates the preparation and submission of comments for the PSC's consideration. These activities can be prioritized to those matters most critical. Reduction in these activities would limit the PSC's ability to ensure policy and regulatory modifications do not negatively impact Florida utilities and consumers.

Chapter 366.04 F.S. gives the Commission limited jurisdiction over the rate structure but not the actual rates of approximately 51 municipal and cooperative utilities. All changes to electric service tariffs for these utilities are filed with the Commission, reviewed by staff, and in most cases administratively approved. Staff currently reviews each filing to ensure that the tariff change 1) does not contain new pricing concepts 2) is cost based and 3) does not constitute a change in rate structure. To reduce the amount of time devoted to this review, the Commission could eliminate the standard that the tariff be cost based and not review tariffs that contain a new pricing concept. This process would not change the Commission's authority over the rate structure of municipals and cooperative utilities. Any

The Commission is in the process of scanning all tariffs to electronic format, thereby reducing staff support needed to physically process and handle tariffs. Pay telephones in Florida have declined drastically over the last decade. In 1996, there were over 1,000 pay telephone service providers in Florida. At the end of 2016, there were 49 pay telephone service providers certificated with the Commission. The majority of the pay telephone service providers are small operations or are pay telephone service providers for the prison systems. Wireless telecommunications has greatly diminished the need for pay telephone service providers. The PSC currently has limited authority over pay telephone service providers and receives very few complaints about pay telephone service. The pay telephone service offered in prisons and jails is done by contract and is not subject to PSC jurisdiction. Section 364.3375, Florida Statutes, will need to be repealed to eliminate the remaining
