Priority #10: Eliminate Crime Scene Response

FDLE has 12 crime scene positions on call 24/7 and respond to requests for examination of major crime scenes throughout the state. The proper documentation, collection and preservation of physical evidence are critical to the successful outcome of criminal investigations. Crime scene processing includes photography, video recording, measuring, sketching, and evidence collection. FDLE received 327 crime scene service requests in FY 19-20. Some medium to large law enforcement agencies have crime scene service within their agencies, but most small agencies do not. Eliminating this service statewide would require local law enforcement agencies to process their own crime scenes, or seek the service through mutual aid agreements with other agencies within the state.

Funds are based on actual collections of fines during the quarter and disbursements may not exceed 75 percent of the actual operating costs of each eligible forensic laboratory. FDLE incurs costs associated with the administration of these funds, but is not authorized to use any of these monies. Elimination of the funds would eliminate FDLE responsibility for administration of this program, freeing manpower to focus on other areas critical to the operations of FDLE.

Priority #9: Eliminate FDLE Role in Economic Crime Investigations

Economic crime includes a wide range of fraudulent activities that are generally complex, involve multiple victims, and have a significant negative impact on the state's residents, visitors, and overall economy. These investigations are often protracted; require special training, and investigative expertise to successfully disrupt the criminal organization/activity. Examples of the types of investigations included in this category are organized retail theft, cargo theft, bank fraud, identity theft (often through the use of skimmers), and other major schemes to defraud including fraud against state government, that are responsible for millions of dollars in business and tax revenue losses each year. In FY 19-20, approximately 34 sworn positions dedicated over 62,378 man-hours to major economic crime cases. Most local law enforcement agencies do not have the financial or investigative resources, or the jurisdictional authority to pursue organized fraud investigations. Elimination of Economic Crime resources would require local agencies to develop

Priority #5: Eliminate FDLE Role in Department of Corrections Investigations

Incidents involving police and corrections personnel use of force and in-custody death incidents attract media attention and invite public scrutiny. Florida law enforcement agencies often request an independent investigation to alleviate citizen concerns and eliminate any perception that internal investigations may be biased. Independent, impartial investigations of this nature are imperative to maintain trust between the criminal justice community and the citizens of Florida. In FY 14-15, the Legislature appropriated FDLE 17 special agent positions to investigate cases of serious injury or death on Florida Department of Corrections (FDC) institutional property or in connection with FDC care, custody or control of inmates while off institutional property. Prior to then, FDLE assisted FDC at the request of their Inspector General's Office or pursuant to Executive Order, but was not the primary investigating authority for this type of crime. In FY 19-20, FDLE worked 131 cases related to FDC cases involving death or serious injury. If these positions are

Priority #13: Eliminate Offender Registration

Since its establishment in 1997, the Sexual offender/Predator Registry has grown in size, scope, services, and functionality. Citizens use FDLE's public sexual offender website to stay informed with regard to the location of registrants so that they can protect themselves and their families. Additionally, the registry provides regular training to local law enforcement agencies regarding use of the registry systems, enhancements, and update registration procedures and requirements. Registry systems are also continually updated to insure the criminal justice community is immediately aware of the identities and arrest notifications of designated high-risk sexual offenders. FDLE received legislative authority to redesign and implement a new Sexual Offender/Predator System which is now providing even greater public access through mobile applications as well as several other improvements that enhance its functionality and streamlines several registry related responsibilities for local law enforcement.

The Florida Career Offender Registry, which is unique to Florida, maintains records of those individuals designated by Florida Statute and convicted of certain violent crimes and/or have multiple felony convictions. There are approximately 18,340 of these most violent career criminals contained in the database; more than 8,137 have been released from incarceration. The registry allows Florida law enforcement and citizens to keep track of these serious offenders within their communities.

Elimination of this function includes the Policy Case Analysis Team, Offender Registration and Data Management Team and

the Unidentified Deceased and Operational Support Team. Eliminating this function will remove any capability for Florida law enforcement or citizens to maintain information regarding potentially dangerous repeat criminals living in communities throughout the state; thereby disregarding an important tool currently available for keeping Florida citizens safe. Additionally, FDLE's current capacity to staff the Florida Missing and Endangered Persons Clearinghouse Advisory Board and investigate and compare unidentified deceased individuals with possible matches to long-term unsolved missing person cases will be lost.

Priority #6: Eliminate Missing and Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse

The Missing and Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MEPIC) is a central repository of information regarding missing persons which complements the state and federal computerized missing persons' files. MEPIC provides analytical and investigative support in the processing of leads associated with missing person cases. The elimination of the MEPIC would discontinue staffing and the 24/7 administration of the AMBER, Missing Child and Silver Alerts thus discontinuing the media, road sign, lottery notifications and electronic mass notification to the public of missing endangered persons including children. In FY 19-20, MEPIC worked 3,791 cases that resulted in the recovery of 35 missing persons (including children), and issued approximately 285 Amber, Missing Child, and Silver alerts. Other services that would be discontinued if these resources are eliminated include partnership with Department of Children and Families (DCF) to assist in locating children missing from foster care, analytical services that facilitate the location and rescue of abducted persons and participation and planning of Florida Missing Children's Day and the Missing Person's Advisory Board.

Priority #8: Eliminate Offender Enforcement and Apprehension Investigations

Currently, there are approximately 78,524 known sexual offenders and an additional 18,340 career offenders either in the state or with ties to Florida. In September 2020, there were approximately 944 sexual offenders and 621 career offenders that were reported to be absconded based on lack of compliance with registration requirements. Due to the nature of the crimes they have already committed, unregistered career offenders are considered to be the most violent offenders in our state. Currently, approximately 17 percent or 1,400 of the released career offender population do not have an FDLE Career Offender registration form on file (Career offenders are often misidentified as criminal registrants, which means that they may have been fingerprinted as a criminal registrant but an FDLE Career Offender registration form was not completed). In 2005, the Legislature passed the Jessica Lunsford Act to strengthen registration timelines, and provided FDLE with positions to provide analytical support to local law enforcement to assist in identifying and locating sex

Priority #7: Eliminate Internet Crimes Against Children Investigations

In 2011 the 17 Florida Attorney General's Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) positions merged with the Florida Cyber Crime Center at FDLE consolidating the state's cybercrime assets and allowing FDLE to expand cybercrime capabilities throughout the state. Cyber assets were deployed to each of FDLE's regional operations centers and FDLE began to put a strategy in place that included assistance to local agencies with cybercrime investigations and training local law enforcement in the use of cyber tools and protocols. Today many local law enforcement agencies have developed ICAC investigators and although these types of cases still represent a significant threat to Florida's citizens, the development of the local agency capabilities is allowing FDLE to expand its cybercrime programs. Priority #13: Eliminate Offender Registration

Since its establishment in 1997, the Sexual offender/Predator Registry has grown in size, scope, services, and functionality. Citizens use FDLE's public sexual offender website to stay informed with regard to the location of registrants so that they can protect themselves and their families. Additionally, the registry provides regular training to local law enforcement agencies regarding use of the registry systems, enhancements, and update registration procedures and requirements. Registry systems are also continually updated to insure the criminal justice community is immediately aware of the identities and arrest notifications of designated high-risk sexual offenders. FDLE received legislative authority to redesign and implement a new Sexual Offender/Predator System which is now providing even greater public access through mobile applications as well as several other improvements that enhance its functionality and streamlines several registry related responsibilities for local law enforcement.

The Florida Career Offender Registry, which is unique to Florida, maintains records of those individuals designated by Florida Statute and convicted of certain violent crimes and/or have multiple felony convictions. There are approximately 18,340 of these most violent career criminals contained in the database; more than 8,137 have been released from incarceration. The registry allows Florida law enforcement and citizens to keep track of these serious offenders within their communities.

Elimination of this function includes the Policy Case Analysis Team, Offender Registration and Data Management Team and the Unidentified Deceased and Operational Support Team. Eliminating this function will remove any capability for Florida law enforcement or citizens to maintain information regarding potentially dangerous repeat criminals living in communities throughout the state; thereby disregarding an important tool currently available for keeping Florida citizens safe. Additionally, FDLE's current capacity to staff the Florida Missing and Endangered Persons Clearinghouse Advisory Board and investigate and compare unidentified deceased individuals with possible matches to long-term unsolved missing person cases will be lost.

Priority #11: Eliminate Information Delivery and Training

FDLE's Information Delivery and Training is responsible for training criminal and non-criminal justice agencies for compliance with state and national policy regarding criminal justice information (CJI) access. The FBI Advisory Policy Board (APB) and National Crime Prevention and Compact Council work with the FBI Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division to provide oversight of criminal and non-criminal justice agencies with regard to how agencies handle CJI. The FBI works under a shared management philosophy that requires states through the CJIS Systems Agency (CSA) to train agencies on all APB and Compact Council policy requirements regarding the protection and authorized use of CJI. FDLE is also required to ensure that operator training mandates are included in training curriculum. That requirement comes in the form of a user agreement signed between the FBI CJIS Division and the CSA, who is FDLE. The agreement requires FDLE to provide training to federal, state, local and tribal agencies with access to CJI. FDLE is audited by the FBI CJIS Division on a triennial basis to ensure the state provides training as required by our user agreement with them. By eliminating the Information Delivery and Training, FDLE would be unable to provide training on CJIS systems throughout the state to criminal and non-criminal justice agencies as required by our user agreement with the FBI CJIS Division. This would lead to the state being sanctioned by the APB and the Compact Council, thus jeopardizing Florida's access to FBI CJIS systems which is a public and officer safety issue. Failure to properly train local agencies on how to enter information completely, accurately and in a timely manner would also have a negative impact on public and officer safety

The FBI Advisory Policy Board (APB) and National Crime Prevention and Compact Council work with the FBI Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Division to provide oversight of criminal and non-criminal justice agencies with regard to how agencies access, handle and use criminal justice information (CJI). The FBI works under a shared management philosophy that requires states through the CJIS Systems Agency (CSA) to ensure all APB and Compact Council policy requirements regarding the protection and authorized use of CJI are adhered to. That requirement comes in the form of a user agreement signed between the FBI CJIS Division and the CSA, who is FDLE. The agreement requires that FDLE audit federal, state, local and tribal agencies with access to CJI on a triennial basis for compliance. FDLE is also audited by the FBI CJIS Division on a triennial basis to ensure the state is conducting compliance audits as required by our user agreement with them. By eliminating the Audit and Compliance Section, FDLE would be unable to conduct compliance audits within the state for criminal and non-criminal justice agencies as required by our user agreement with the FBI CJIS Division. This would lead to the state being sanctioned by the APB and the Compact Council thus jeopardizing Florida's access to FBI CJIS systems which is a public and officer safety issue. Failure to ensure that local agencies are entering information completely, accurately and in a timely manner would also have a negative impact on public and officer safety not only in Florida but across the nation.

Positions in this section were reclassified to make salaries comparable with FDLE's crime laboratory personnel as they have the same accreditation requirement in fiscal year 2019-2020 to enable the Department better recruitment options. Elimination of the Alcohol Testing Program would remove any independent inspection of the instruments or permitting of blood alcohol analysts, which would cause significant issues in the courts. Additionally, there would be no training/certification available for Agency Inspectors and Breath Test Operators which is critical from a credibility standpoint in court proceedings.

Priority #4: Eliminate Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute and FDLE Leadership Center

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute (FCJEI) was established in 1990 to provide criminal justice executives with quality leadership training that is unique to Florida's complex issues. Since its creation, the FCJEI has expanded its programs to consist of training from first line supervisors through chief executives and all ranks in between. The FDLE Leadership Center provides internal training for FDLE members, provides on-line training for local criminal justice officers to help fulfill their required continuing education training and provides specialized training for crime intelligence analysts from all criminal justice agencies. Elimination of the FCJEI would force local criminal justice agencies to seek leadership-based training from entities not familiar with the specific issues facing Florida. Elimination of the FDLE Leadership Center would force local criminal justice agencies to send their officers to classroom instruction to obtain required continuing education training and their analysts to intelligence training outside of Florida. In addition, FDLE would be forced to seek training for its members from an outside source. These training alternatives, in many cases, would be cost prohibitive to state and local participants.

Priority #3: Eliminate Florida Accreditation Office

The Florida Accreditation Office (FAO) administers the state accreditation process for law enforcement agencies, inspectors general offices, county correctional facilities and pretrial service offices. FAO is responsible for coordinating the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) and the Florida Corrections Accreditation Commission (FCAC) meetings; conducting outreach to agencies in all disciplines; providing training to assessors, accreditation managers and the accreditation community; assisting agencies in achieving accreditation; and acting as an information and materials resource for individuals and agencies participating in the process. As of July 1, 2020, there are 249 agencies accredited through the two state accreditation commissions, which provides a financially and programmatically responsible alternative to national accreditation organizations. If FAO is eliminated, the referenced Commissions would be required to obtain an alternate source of funding to staff and administer their programs.
