Eliminating funding for the program will present minimal impacts, as the program has not been established long enough to demonstrate successes.

The Florida Sports Foundation (FSF), program supports communities in their effort to attract sporting events that have a measurable, positive economic impacts on the community. Events range from youth sports to professional sports championships. The trust fund is financed by fees collected on the sale of professional sports license tags and is maintained by the Department. FSF will be better able to serve communities as a standalone organization not reliant on state appropriations, instead engaging with teams, promotions, and communities to leverage private donations and other resources to support events.
